Year 2 Paddington's Adventures!

Welcome to Year 2! As we begin our learning adventure together, it is time to pack our bags and set off for a journey around the United Kingdom. This half term's learning will see the children receive a visit from Paddington Bear. Paddington wants to find out all about the United Kingdom, including the names and location of England, Wales, Northern Ireland and Scotland along with their capital cities. Paddington does not know what to wear in the UK so he also wants to know about the countries' seasonal and daily weather patterns. In addition to this, he would like the children to help him use a map to identify where he is in relation to his home, Peru and he wants to learn about the Queen! While visiting, Paddington will also explain to the children that he has noticed his diet could be healthier and that he could start to exercise more too. The children will help him by learning together about different food groups and the importance of exercise.
